CEO's Corner

TOMO'S LAST DAY AND WELCOME PHIL BURGESS

Last week the shire team enjoyed a BBQ lunch at the depot with Tomo on his last day. We also welcomed the new Manager of Works and Services, Mr Phil Burgess, to town and he spent a couple of days out on the roads with Tomo in an attempt to pass on more than 37 years of knowledge.

Phil and his partner Debbie will be in town from 1 July so please say hello and make them welcome. Debbie has experience in working in the childcare industry and has been up to Giggle Pots to see if they need some help which I am sure was very well received.

OPENING NEW AGED HOUSING UNITS

I was so excited to see this project finally completed after I started working on the initial business case in 2015 while working at Shire of Wickepin.

At the time the Wheatbelt South Aged Housing Alliance was formed with eight local governments including the Shires of Corrigin, Cuballing, Kondinin, Kulin, Narembene, Narrogin, Wandering and Wickepin. The purpose of the alliance was to build on existing partnerships to improve access to services, deliver efficiencies to service providers and support the growth of the aged care and health services sector in the region.

A starting point for the project was to conduct a comprehensive aged housing needs analysis.

In 2016 Verso Consulting Pty Ltd calculated a projected demand for 100 independent living units in the ten years to 2026 across the eight shires in the region with a further demand for land assembly and town planning of an additional 158 units.

We developed an initial Business Case to build 38 units across seven shires over three year period valued at \$12million.

After the disappointment of our funding application being declined we reassessed and the Alliance reduced to five shires and Narrogin Cottage Homes. We worked with Regional Development Australia and submitted a Building Better Regional application in December 2017 for 20 units across six towns but unfortunately this application was also not forthcoming.

Not to be deterred we pushed on and resubmitted an application to the Regional Aged Accommodation Program 2018. We were excited to hear that our project had received funding in 2018, only to find ourselves disappointed that the project would need to be resubmitted following the change of government in 2019.

We finally received confirmation in December 2019 that the Alliance was successful in receiving Royalties for Regions funding of \$2.8m to build 14 units in five towns. Certainly much less than the original 38 units in eight towns but a welcome boost none the less.

Thank you to the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development and Minister for Regional Development for committing the funding and to the departmental staff for working with the Alliance members over such a long time.

Thank you to the Shire of Corrigin Council for committing to the project over such a long time.

Thanks must also go to the Shire of Wickepin as the lead agency in this project and the Shires of Kondinin and Cuballing for staying with the Alliance over the past 6 years and working tirelessly for to deliver new aged housing units to their communities.

Thank you to Greg Tomlinson, Manager of Works and Services and his team and especially Kody Broun and Emma Shaw for managing the building project so well. Kody and Emma were very new to the shire when we put out the tenders for the project in June 2020 and it has been a steep learning curve, but one they have both handled extremely well.

Thank you to Stallion Homes for working with us to deliver the two units on time and on budget. We found Andrew and the team were a pleasure to work with from the time the pad was put down in September 2020 to May 2021 when the buildings were completed with only a couple of minor issues along the way that were easily resolved.

I think you will all agree that building the two units in around seven months from start to finish is an almighty achievement especially during COVID and with the shortages of trades.

So after waiting six long years to secure the funding to build two new units they are finally ready to hand over to the Corrigin **Senior Citizen's Committee**. The committee of volunteers do an amazing job of managing the 15 existing units in the Seniors Village and I have complete confidence they will manage the new units as well.

July 2021 Council Decisions

STRATEGIC COMMUNITY PLAN AND CORPORATE BUSINESS PLAN

The results from the Shire of Corrigin Strategic Community Plan 2021-2031 survey, workshops, phone calls and conversations have been analysed, with the key findings outlining the community's priorities and aspirations for the shire and helping shape the future vision.

A total of 266 surveys were received from a wide cross section of the community.

The results highlighted that the community's priorities for the shire focused on the following key areas:

1. Access to medical and allied health services
2. Facilities, services and care available for seniors
3. Tourism and promotion of our community
4. Services and facilities for young people
5. Road maintenance

Thank you to everyone who contributed their feedback, thoughts and ideas to this major review of the Plan.

The final plan has been endorsed by Council and will soon be available on the shire website.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR EMPLOYEES

The Council was advised that the CEO had developed a new Code of Conduct for Employees to comply with new legislation and includes new requirements for local government employees in relation to gifts, conflicts of interest disclosures.

DELEGATION REGISTER REVIEW

Council reviewed and endorsed the Delegation Register at the last meeting as it is required to do every year.

Council can delegate certain powers and duties to the CEO and the CEO, in turn, can on-delegate those powers and functions to other employees.

DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORT LICENSING AGREEMENT

The provision of licensing services at the Shire of Corrigin is delivered as a service to the community. The cost of providing the service is partially offset by a commission fee received from the Department of Transport for undertaking the services on their behalf. Council endorsed the new agreement with the Department of Transport for licensing services over the next five years.

DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION – PROPOSED HAY STORAGE SHED - GORGE ROCK

Council granted conditional approval to a development application received from [Wheatbelt Steel Pty Ltd on behalf the Landowner to](#) construct a new 768m² hay storage shed on their property in Gorge Rock.

DUAL FIRE CONTROL OFFICERS 2021/22

The Shire of Corrigin agreed to appoint Dual Fire Control Officers from the Shire of Pingelly for the 2021/2022 bush fire season.

TENDER MECHANICAL SERVICES_2021-2023

Council approved the tenderer from Western Stabilisers Pty Ltd for heavy plant and machinery servicing on an hourly basis for the 2021/22 financial year plus an option for a further year.

LOCAL ROADS AND COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM PHASE 3

Following previous consultation with Council, contractors and staff, the completion of the project was selected as the highest priority project for the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCIP) Phase 3 grant. The project meets the eligibility requirements of the grant funding and is achievable by the June 2023 timeframe.

Stevenson Scholarship for Further Education

APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN

The Stevenson Scholarship was established by the late Edna Stevenson (a former resident of the Shire of Corrigin) to promote and advance the education of the residents of the Shire of Corrigin. Stevenson Scholarships are administered by the Trustees of the Edna Stevenson Trust.

Eligibility

Stevenson Scholarships are available to students who are residents of the Shire of Corrigin and/or whose parents or guardians are not able to provide sufficient financial assistance for the student to achieve a tertiary education.

Resident Status

Residents are defined as:

- (a) A person residing in the Shire of Corrigin at the time of applying for the Stevenson Scholarship.
- (b) A former resident of the Shire of Corrigin (of not more than two years absence) who was a

student at a school in the Shire of Corrigin for at least three years whose immediate family resides in Corrigin.

Student Status

Students must be enrolled in and attending any of the following:

- (a) Corrigin District High School
- (b) Any government run senior high school in Western Australia
- (c) An agricultural high school or college in Western Australia
- (d) A TAFE college in Western Australia
- (e) A university in Western Australia

Scholarships

Scholarships provide financial assistance to help cover the costs of text books, enrolment fees and course fees at approved educational institutions.

The following amounts are indicative only, lesser or greater amounts may be awarded depending on the course of study and financial need:

- SECONDARY STUDY up to \$2,000
- TERTIARY STUDY up to \$5,000

Scholarships are awarded for one year periods. Scholarship recipients may apply for further scholarships on a year by year basis.
